Digital Safety Tips

Keep all computers, games, and other digital devices in a common area in the house.

Learn more about the sites/apps your child is using, and read the terms and conditions before agreeing to their use.

Monitor your child's online accounts and review your child's digital use and history. Use these opportunities to teach them about potential digital dangers and digital safety.

Be a good role model for your child and model good digital behavior.

Establish rules or guidelines for your child's digital use, regarding the length of time they are allowed on the computer and other digital devices, and regarding the use of age appropriate approved websites and apps.



Clinician and Forensic Interviewer 2 years and 10 months at The CAC (5 years and 1 month at another advocacy center!)

What is your motivation for the work that you do at The CAC?

As an interviewer, I am humbled every time I listen to a child tell their story. When I think about the amount of courage, resilience, and strength it takes for a child to speak to someone they just met about intimate details about some of the worst days of their life, I remember why I do this work. In my role as a clinician, I have the privilege of listening to children explain the impact this abuse has had on them. Most people don't realize the power of listening. When a child tells me, "You made this easier for me to talk about," I feel a sense of pride and motivation. There is no work more rewarding than facilitating healing.

The mission of The CAC is to provide a professional, compassionate and coordinated approach to the treatment of sexually abused children and their families and to serve as an advocate for all children in our community.
