Mission of The CAC



- One in 10 children will be sexually abused before age 18.* 1
- 95% of sexual abuse is preventable through education and awareness.*2
- Approximately 79,000 minors and youth are victims of sex trafficking in Texas. * 3
- There are 42 million sexual abuse survivors in the United States how you
 report and cover stories may affect them.
- 90% of child sexual abuse victims know their abuser and perpetrators often groom victims and their families.* ⁴
- Only 4-8% of child sexual abuse reports are fabricated.* 5
